Arrival at Ben Gurion airport and drive to Jaffa for a walking tour of the old Jaffa City. Check in to your hotel. Dinner at the hotel. Dinner and overnight: Tel Aviv hotel

### Day 2 – February 28, 2026

Breakfast at the hotel.

**Peres Center for Peace and Innovation:** Discover the spirit of Israel through the legacy of Shimon Peres—where peace, technology, and Jewish values meet. Overlooking the sea in Jaffa, the Peres Center offers an inspiring journey through Israeli innovation, showcasing groundbreaking achievements and powerful peace initiatives. A thought-provoking and uplifting experience that connects past, present, and future.



Walk along **Independence Trail:** Stroll through the heart of Tel Aviv and follow the golden trail where Israel's modern history began. From the Declaration of Independence at Dizengoff House to hidden gems of the first Hebrew city, this guided walk blends heritage, culture, and the pioneering spirit that shaped a nation.

**Carmel Market – Taste, Explore, Wander:** Explore Tel Aviv's bustling Carmel Market with a tour and your personal **Shuk Bite card**—your passport to sample delicious local treats. ## Day 5 - March 3, 2026 - Purim ends at nightfall

## Day 6 – March 4, 2026

## Day 7 –March 5, 2026

## Day 8 – March 6, 2026

**Visit Kibbutz Nir Oz:** Step into the story of **Kibbutz Nir Oz**, a peaceful community turned symbol of unimaginable loss and enduring strength. Here, in the Gaza Envelope, we pause to honor the lives shattered and the spirit that refuses to break. Through guided reflection and respectful presence, we bear witness to the events of **October 7**, drawing strength from the courage of survivors and the commitment to rebuild what was taken. A visit that leaves no one unchanged.

**Nova Festival:** At the edge of a quiet field near Re'im, we pause at the site of the **Nova music festival**, once a place of joy, unity, and celebration. On **October 7**, that spirit was shattered. Today, it stands as a haunting reminder of lives lost and innocence stolen. Meet a survivor to hear their testimonial. Alumim lunch at the Kibbutz dining room.

**Tkuma** A powerful stop that connects us to the soul of Israel's southern spirit. Dinner on own. Overnight: Jerusalem.

## Day 9 – March 7, 2026

**Massada:** Rise above the Judean Desert to the ancient stronghold of **Masada**, where stones whisper stories of bravery and unwavering spirit. Walk among the ruins of King Herod's palace and stand where Jewish rebels made their final stand for freedom. With sweeping views of the Dead Sea, this mountaintop tells a timeless tale of courage and conviction.

**Ein Gedi:** Discover the lush oasis of **Ein Gedi**, where waterfalls flow between desert cliffs and ancient trails lead to hidden springs. Once a refuge for King David, today it's a

sanctuary of natural wonder and quiet reflection—an unforgettable blend of history, wildlife, and serene landscapes. Back to Jerusalem Farewell dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight: Jerusalem.

## Day 10 – March 8, 2026

Transfer to the airport for your flight back home.

### Terms and Conditions

**Passport** - A passport is required to board an international flight and travel to Israel. If you do not have a current passport, please make an appointment with the postal service and allow 10 weeks after your appointment to complete the renewal process in the US. Passports must be valid until September 9, 2026 for this tour. Additionally, the State of Israel now requires you to obtain an ETA-IL visa at least three days prior to your arrival in Israel.

**Travel Insurance** is HIGHLY recommended for international travel. For best coverage, purchase your travel insurance within 2 weeks of booking your tour. Compare travel insurance options at this website: [TravelInsurance.com](http://TravelInsurance.com)

**Deposits and Payments** - A deposit of \$500 is required from each traveler, along with your reservation form, to guarantee your space on the tour. The remaining balance is due in 2 payments.

1. Airfare Payment is due upon ticketing the flight.

2. Final Payment is due 11/15/25. See Terms and Conditions for late payment penalties.  
3. A supplement for single occupancy must be paid in full with the final payment.

### Health and Mobility Challenges

Tours in Israel include areas that have uneven footing, few handrails, rocky pathways, and some steep climbs. The streets and sites we visit are not wheelchair and walker friendly. Most of our tours include 3-5 miles of walking per day. Guests with mobility challenges or other health issues should make private arrangements to travel with a caregiver who can stay with them if they need to opt out of a tour stop. Bus drivers are allowed breaks, and guests cannot be left alone on the bus if the bus is locked and unattended. If you have health challenges, please consult an Aliyah Tours representative before you put down a deposit on a tour.
